The vision lives on: Since stepping down as mayor of Miami he is still a force in local, state and national politics. He was instrumental in developing Miami 21, a more inclusive urban vision for Miami, re-inventing it as a truly cosmopolitan city through innovative programs in the areas of urban design, infrastructure investment, sustainability, arts and culture. The shelves of his current real estate law practice at Lydecker Diaz are stuffed with leadership awards, as well as sports mementos. An avid baseball fan, he played an important role in negotiating the new Miami Marlins stadium.
